8 MILES OF SIDEWALKS TO BE BUILT

Monmouth County has received \$1.4 million in federal money to build eight miles of sidewalks in 11 municipalities.

The county applied for the federal grant, paid for the engineering, and will oversee the project, according to Monmouth County Engineer Theodore Glannechini. In exchange, the municipalities maintain the sidewalks and acquire any right of way, he said.

Monmouth County Board of Freeholders yesterday approved the agreement. The project, for which the county needs to get a contractor, is expected to begin in spring and take six months to complete, he said.

The eight miles of sidewalks will be in:

- Atlantic Highlands, on County Route 8A (also known as Ocean Boulevard), from Mount Mitchell to an existing path along a shopping center;
- Eatontown, on County Route 537 (Tinton Avenue) from Maxwell Road to Route 35;
- Freehold Township on County Route 537 (West Main Street) from Route 9 to Trotters Way; and on County Route 46 (Dutch Lane Road) from the Freehold Borough border to Wilson Avenue;

- Holmdel on County Route 520 (Newman Springs Road) from Middletown Road to Middletown border;

- Middletown on County Route 520 (Newman Springs Road) from the Holmdel border to Lincoln School;

- Long Branch and West Long Branch on County Route 25 (Norwood Avenue) from Overton Place in Long Branch to Beechwood Avenue in West Long Branch;

- West Long Branch on County Route 15 (Locust Avenue) south of Delaware Avenue to Walnut Place;

- Neptune Township on County Route 17 (West Bangs Avenue) from Route 18 to West Lake Avenue to Doremus to Heck Avenue.

- Wall on County Route 30 (18th Avenue) from New Bedford Road to the athletic fields;

- Freehold on County Route 46 (Dutch Lane Road) missing segments from Route 79 to Freehold Township border;

- Aberdeen on County Route 3 (Lloyd Road) missing sections around Warren Drive and Overlea Lane and on County Route 6A (Cliffwood Avenue) the missing sections along Rose Street.
